
Dyslexia Friendly: The book is likely to have yellower pages, serif fonts, and more white space.

Reluctant Reader: A book designed for a reluctant reader is a book that is specifically created to engage and encourage individuals who may be hesitant or unenthusiastic about reading. It is a rapid read for kids who don't enjoy reading or have reading difficulties (and might have more visuals).

Low Page Density: This book is likely to have more white space and fewer words per page, readers may find it easier to comprehend and retain information.



In this aquatic-themed story, a group of toddlers explore a rockpool at the beach and count the creatures they see. Counting up to ten, some of the creatures they spot are urchins, moon snails, clams, crabs, dragons, octopuses, and sea stars.

Using gentle rhyme, this picture book has evocative illustrations that cleverly show different perspectives: sea creatures below the water, creatures below and above, and curious toddlers above looking below.

Can an anxious and unsure Ravi find the bravery he needs to take flight?


NOVEL INSIGHT REVIEW

Ravi loves ladybirds and only wants to do everything a ladybird would do. On his first day of daycare, he is nervous. Ladybirds don't go to daycare!. He comes downstairs, and his mother says his cornflakes are on the table. But ladybirds don't eat cornflakes. Ravi's mum corrects herself, pretending they are aphids, and Ravi slurps his bowl clean. He then races outside to find some fresh, crunchy aphids. It's cold outside, so Ravi's mum offers him a jumper.



Although he knows ladybirds don't wear jumpers, he is cold and decides to wear it—taking care not to crush his wings. Ravi is still uncertain about daycare but agrees to go if they fly there! When they get to daycare, Ravi wants to go home. But mum says they should check if ladybirds go to daycare first. Ravi takes a deep breath to remind himself that ladybirds are brave and heads for the flowerbeds. They see a ladybird, and Ravi learns that ladybirds do go to daycare. 

People are rapidly buying and disposing of new products, causing the town dump to grow. During an extreme weather event, the trash is blown throughout the town, and the department store roof blows off. Ruby suggests the townsfolk help fix it together, and they all make it more beautiful than before. With a newfound unity, the repair cafe joins the department store as an extra department. 
A wonderful picture book about playfulness and the joy of light and movement.



Each time Ship leaves the port, Tug is left behind. While Ship sails the sea, Tug keeps working hard at port, missing Ship more and more each day. But when Ship returns, Tug's world is bright again as Ship relays all the adventures it went on. 



This story has been told orally by many generations over thousands of years and is intrinsic to the Yidinji culture, both past and present. The call of the storm bird helps the Yidinji people prepare for the arrival of rain or the wet season. During the dry season the Gimuy Walubara people would dance and mimic the storm bird to bring in the rain.

Gurril loves listening to stories about Gudju-gudju, the rainbow serpent. Although others were afraid of the serpent's power, Gurril did not understand why. One day, Gurril went walking to the cave where the rainbow serpent slept. He would decide if the serpent should be feared. Tired of waiting, Gurril picked up a stone and threw it toward the cave. But, nothing happened. Gurril threw another stone, and the ground began to shake. The rainbow serpent slithered out of its cave, looking for the creature that had waken him. To show Gudju-gudju that he was not afraid, Gurril decided to wait until night to torment the snake. Using embers to make black paint, Gurril painted his body to stay hidden. 

Their shade keeps the water cool, and the roots hold riverbanks. Trees also give many gifts, including bush tea and tasty fruit. Aboriginal tribes followed the lore of the trees for thousands of years you must take gifts from the trees without killing them. Unfortunately, many people have disobeyed these lores, and the land has become sick. Plants and animals are becoming extinct. Thankfully, people are learning now, but work is needed to repair the damage. An engaging and educational story about the value of trees and the necessity it is to keep them alive.
